Revised Nomination Deadline: May 1, 2020

The *Langmuir* Lectureship recognizes two individuals working in the interdisciplinary field of colloid and surface chemistry. The winners will give their lectures at a dedicated symposium at the 2020 ACS Fall National Meeting in San Francisco, California.

Each 2020 Winner will receive:

- An award plaque
- An honorarium of US\$3,000
- Up to US\$1,500 in travel and accommodations funding to attend and present at the 2020 ACS Fall National Meeting

Additional Information:

- Following the lecture, the winners each will be invited to write a Feature Article for publication in *Langmuir* based on their lecture. The manuscript will be subject to peer review.

To make a nomination, please upload a **SINGLE PDF FILE** containing the following items **in this order by May 1, 2020** at <https://connect.acspubs.org/lectureship>:

1. A nomination letter that provides insight into the impact of the individual's research accomplishments and their relevance to applications and also addresses the nominee's ability to give a dynamic lecture to a broad audience
2. A supporting letter from another individual familiar with the nominee's work
3. Second letter of support (optional)
4. The nominee's CV including education, appointments, honors and awards, a list of up to 25 relevant publications, and a short description of highlights of research activities.
